### Afternoon workshops

The 2 afternoon workshops run parallel, twice -so everyone got to attend each workshop.

**Workshop objectives:** Look at issues associated with the engagement of young people, the priority topics and assessing the key aspects of importance to the Policy Makers.

**Afternoon workshops** (each currently 1:15):

1. Workshop run by young people (organised by YWI and LYIT) e.g.
  - in order to give others a flavour of their experiences as Internet users.
  - or about youth consultation –i.e. the processes they use, the ones that have been used so far (e.g. to choose topics)
  - or about their involvement in HUWY
2. Making a difference - how to translate engagement into change (organised by Ministry of Justice). Workshop will explore:
  - young people's expectations of how their contributions should be listened to
  - the wider policy making context and how evidence from a variety of sources is assessed and contributes towards policy making
  - how connections between the contribution of young people and policy making might be improved
  - how HUWY inputs map onto current UK policy agendas
  - what might happen next
