

All Hands Meeting 2: Call for Papers

The second All Hands Meeting is being held at the East Midlands Conference Centre, Nottingham from 2nd - 4th September. The theme of this year's meeting is *Delivering e-Science* – currently many projects have deliverables and results to share with the community, and there is a clear understanding of the effort required to deliver the e-Science vision. There are several options for participation, including Parallel sessions, Poster Presentations, Mini Workshops and Birds of a Feather meetings. Each of these require an abstract to be submitted for consideration by the Programme Committee and should be no more than one page of plain text. As the number of each type of presentation is constrained, there will be a selection process. Abstract submissions can be submitted any time from 7 April to 1 June. NeSC's involvement at this stage is in hosting cyberchair, to which abstracts should be submitted:
